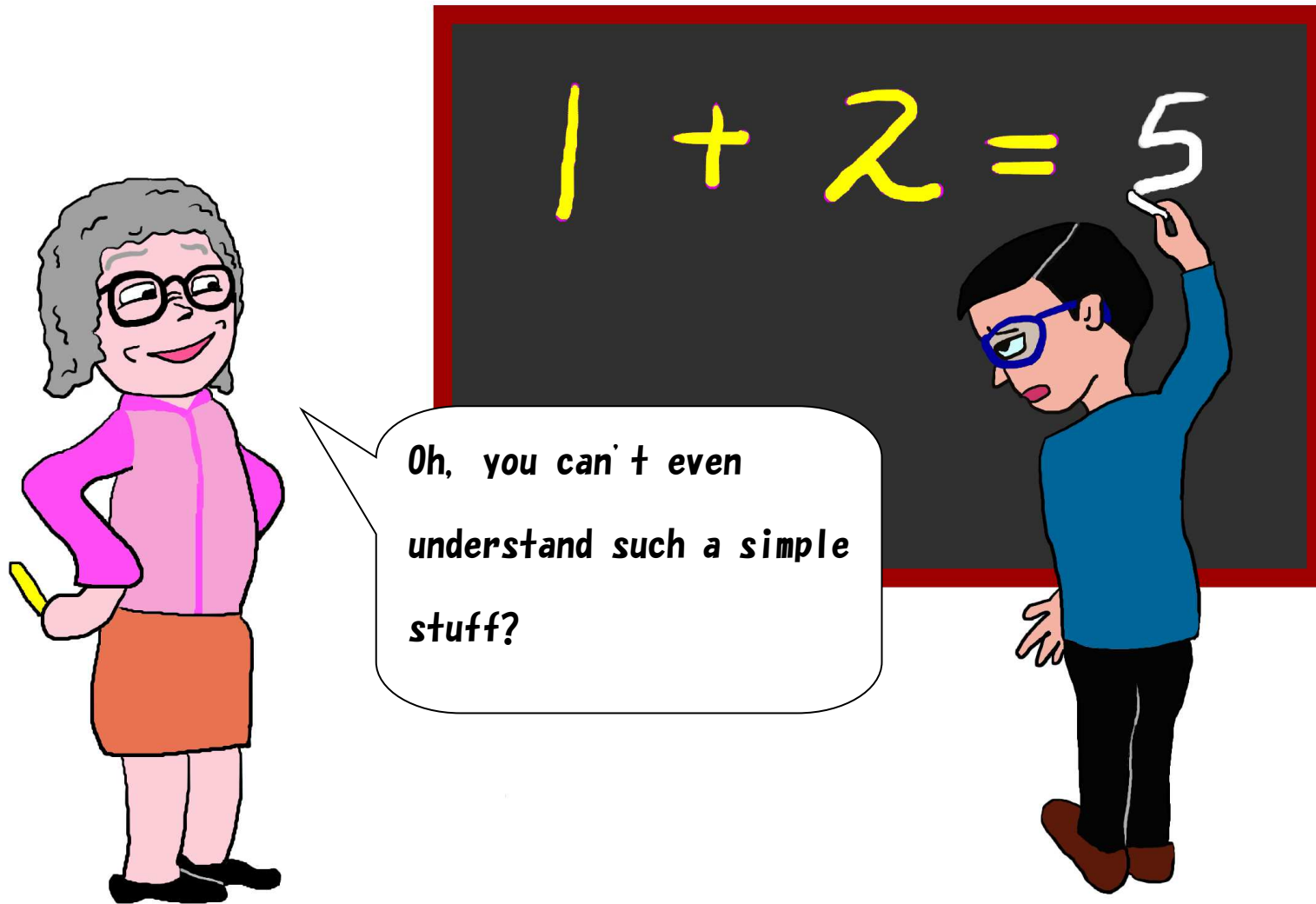


You can scorn

I am more stupid than others.

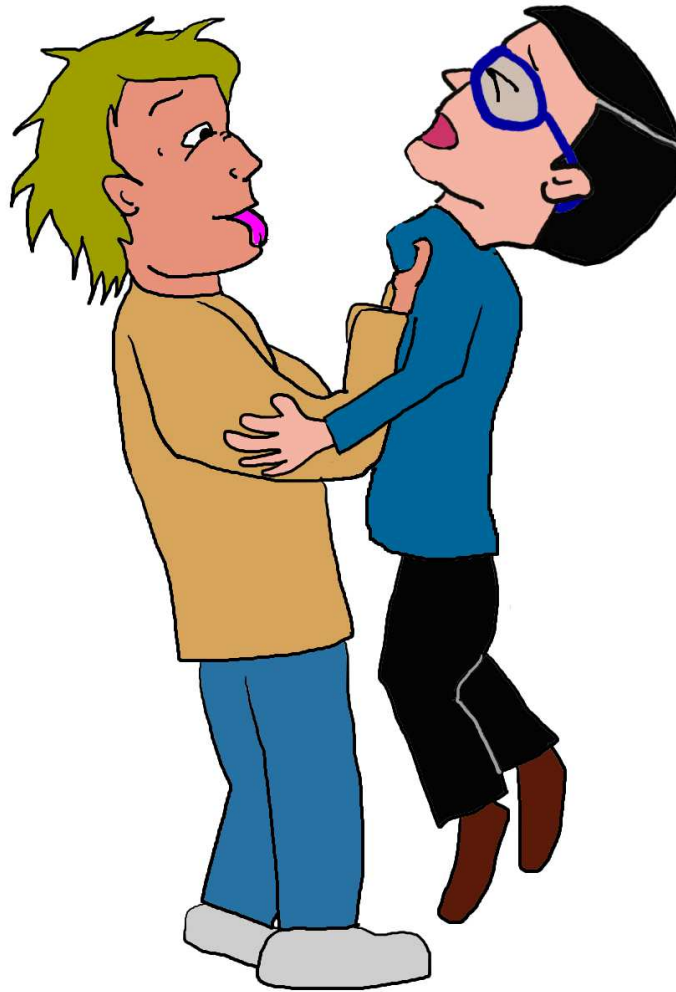


I have also little money.

I wanna also look down on somebody!**



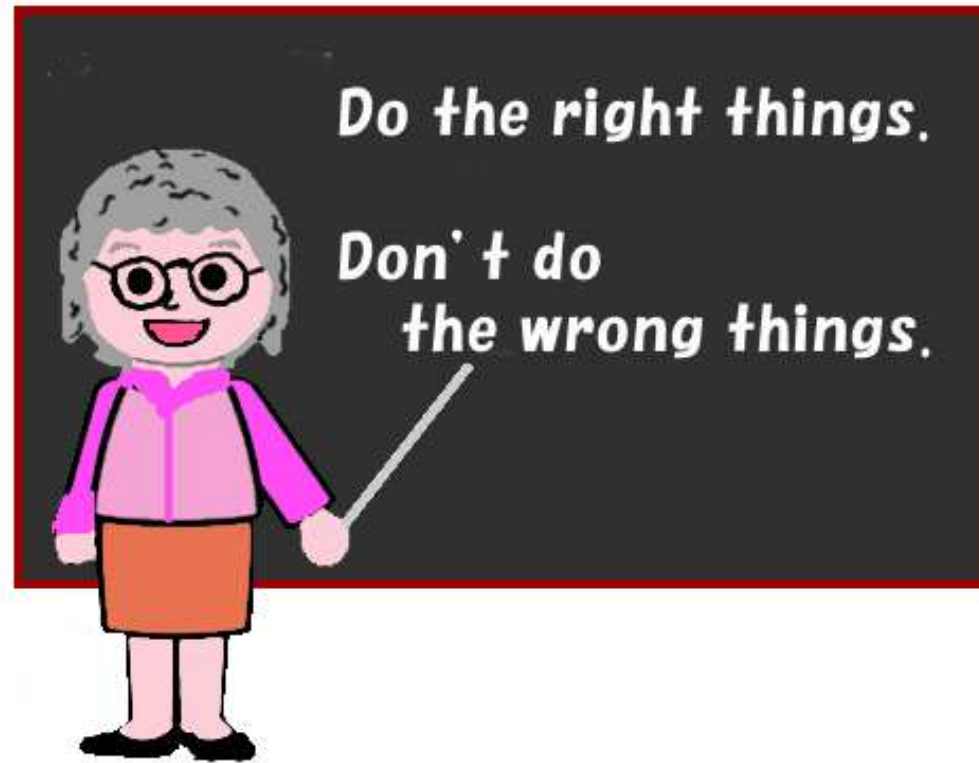
No problem! There is a way to look down on everybody!
