
Love & Fairness on Apple


The two men shared an apple in friendly manner.

The two men kept arguing to eat the apple. No conclusion was reached.




The two men shared the apple according to their agreement.




Both men are very satisfied.

Culture of Love & Culture of Fairness


Now what will happen if the two men belong to a different culture respectively? Please assume that both of them are hungry and know that their opponent is also hungry.
