
Minorities in a village




Jun Togo

The people who loved baseball were very upset. Needless to say, they were against the proposal.



Drinking has now been prohibited by 30 votes against 20 votes.


Some of the villagers look unhappy. They are the ones who are prohibited from playing baseball and/or drinking.



There are 10 people in the village who are willingly to eat an animal with long ears.






Eating the animal was now prohibited by 40 votes against 10 votes.


³ N.B The writer has no intention to argue if a different dietary culture, such as a meat-eating one or vegetarianism, is good or bad in this picture book.

One day, it was decided to build a new power plant and an airport⁴ in the village.






However there was a concern. Nobody wants to build them near his/her house. So their locations were to be decided democratically by majority rule.

⁴ N.B The writer has no intention to argue if a power plant (including a nuclear power station) or an airport (including a military base) is good or bad in this picture book.


Most of the villagers look unhappy. They are the ones who are prohibited from baseball, drinking, eating the animal and/or the ones who have a power plant or an airport nearby.



There are 5 people in the village, who love people of the same sex.






Homosexuality act was now prohibited by 45 votes to 5.

⁵ N.B The writer has no intention to argue if homosexuality is good or bad in this picture book.



There are 5 people in the village, who love children's sexual photos and pictures.





There is a grass in the village, which you can burn and smoke, that makes the smoker feel happy. 10 of the villagers love it.





There are 20 people in the village, who do not worship the God⁸ of their village.





 $^{^{8}\,}$ N.B The writer has no intention to argue if worshiping the God is good or bad in this picture book.



There are 5 people in the village, who earn by prostitution.9






Prostitution was now prohibited by 45 votes to 5.

 $^{^{9}}$ N.B The writer has no intention to argue if prostitution is good or bad in this picture book.



There are 15 people in the village, who love gambling.




